



OCTOBER REPORT.

1. 4WDs can take part in a Tractor Pull to be held at Ulverstone in November. A special sledge is used for 4WDs and contestants must join the Tractor Association to compete.
2. 4WD TAS will be voting to retain TCIS as the insurer for the next term of the contract.
3. The Northern Explorers have completed work on the Jeep Track at Pyengana. One end of the track is accessed at the St Columba Falls car park.
4. The working bee planned for 6-7th October has been postponed to a date to be fixed. Parks considered that more damage would be done to the track due to the amount of rain that has fallen in the area.
5. Huon Valley 4WD Club is running a 4WD Information stand at the Huon Show.
6. A 4WD Gathering is to be held at Kellivie early next year.
